

A Message From Our President



When I look back at the impact God had on our ministry in 2015, I can't help but be encouraged by the new opportunities God has placed in our path. For example, he guided us as we helped one of our longtime ministry partners in Guatemala, Carlos Vargas, build homes for 27 needy families. It was a very ambitious project, and required a great deal of coordination on everyone's part (see the full story on pages 8-9).

The most wonderful thing about this housing project was the transformation of spirit that took place as soon as the recipients moved into their new homes. From the moment they received their keys and family Bible, each family

knew it was a divine moment and offered their praise to God. And I was so moved that each family was immediately put in touch with a local church, bringing the body of Christ together.

Another thing I am encouraged by is the impact you have had on our ministry. Your involvement continues to change lives around the globe. One example in particular comes to mind when one of our donors was with us on a mission trip to Haiti.

We were touring schools and we came across this little boy — it was clear he was very poor. Our donor spoke to the little boy's father, whose dire situation was compounded by the deplorable conditions in which the family lived. Their one-room house was cobbled together out of tarps and tin. The children slept on the hard dirt floor, which often became muddy when it rained.

The father was asked what he needed most, and he replied desperately, "A home." Our donor put his hand on the man's shoulder and replied, "We're giving your family a home!" What an extraordinary moment! What an amazing impact!

Through gifts large and small, you and donors like you have had a similar impact on our ministry and have blessed Christian missionaries all over the globe. You can read about those accomplishments in this report.

I pray that you'll see this Annual Report as a celebration of the impact God has had as we have pursued his will through our integral ministry. Each time you saved a child from chronic hunger or improved a family's standard of living through a sturdy new home, you manifested that love of God in a real and tangible way.

I also pray that you'll see this Annual Report as a call to action. Just like the apostles who received the Holy Spirit, we are continually called to be Christ's hands and feet in the world. If we remain faithful, I can only imagine the blessings God has in store for us in the years to come!

WATER OF LIFE

For generations, desperate families from two remote Nicaraguan villages had been struggling hopelessly to find safe water. They had endured terrible hardships and become skeptical about any solution to their problems ever coming. Still, they prayed.

In 2015, God answered those prayers. You responded to their need. Through your gifts, our ministry partners at **Amigos for Christ** were empowered to provide clean water systems, pipelines and modern bathroom facilities for more than 300 Nicaraguan villagers in the communities of La Coyotera and Las Torres. And now, they have water!

The wells have been drilled. Clean, safe, drinkable water is flowing. The installation of the solar panels that power the pumps is already complete. All that remains is the digging of the trenches, the laying of the pipes and the construction of the modern bathrooms. The villagers know that this project — like all water projects — is a long seven-year process. It will take a lot of man hours to get the water piped directly into their homes. But the fact they actually have water has transformed the spirit of these two communities. And they praise God for their good fortune! "We are very happy we won't have to carry buckets on our head anymore..." Gregoria Lopez

A Family Transformed

Your gifts in 2015 have dramatically impacted people like Roberto Lopez, a 15-year-old who is wheelchair-bound and has lived in Las Torres his entire life. Since he was a young boy, his mother Gregoria has been bathing Roberto outdoors using buckets of water she carried on her head from the community well. Now, Roberto and Gregoria are ecstatic that their family actually has water! All they have to do is go to the well and turn on the spigot. Clean water flows and flows! It motivates them to work hard on the final phase of the project, to ensure that the trenches will be dug quickly and the pipes will be laid, delivering water directly into their home.

Gregoria Lopez is especially excited about the prospect of having a new bathroom and shower. It will make caring for Roberto's special needs much easier and more sanitary than relying on contaminated river water.

"We are very happy we won't have to carry buckets on our head anymore," Gregoria said. "We will have a place to bathe the kids at home."

Gregoria was especially enthusiastic when we spoke to her about the final phase of the project. "We're ready," she said with a gleam in her eye. "We're just waiting for the word to start digging!"

Your gift has transformed the spirit of this sweet family. Because of you, Gregoria will soon be able to care for her handicapped son with clean water in her own home. And that is a blessing from God!


John Divens Avril, 8,

HOPE FOR THE CHILDREN

The **Divine Shelter Schools** (DSS) network has been a ministry partner of Cross International since 2004. We have seen the relationship grow steadily from partial support supplementing the needs of Calvary Baptist Church in Haiti to a more complete, hands-on partnership. Today, Cross International is fully committed to the Divine Shelter Schools, with a permanently staffed satellite office in Port-au-Prince that works closely with the schools to bless needy children with an academic foundation and the good news of Jesus Christ.

> In 2015, our total aid encompassed shipping, education and feeding programs that reached more than 4,220 DSS students spread out among 17 schools. In total, Divine Shelter Schools received support for student lunches, teacher and staff salaries, education costs, and the construction of new, improved school facilities.

Through the Gospel, the Divine Shelter Schools are renewing minds and transforming hearts. Students are receiving a solid education, and they are learning to use their knowledge to build God's kingdom and submit to the will of God. Armed with a solid foundation, these children will become the next generation of Christian leaders in Haiti. We pray that they will one day lead their country out of poverty and into a hopeful future built on the Good News.

Claudia's Blessing

Claudia Sosa was widowed at an early age when her husband lost his life on his way to America in search of a better future for his family. But she persevered, moving her children into an old shack built of sticks and scrap lumber, which offered no protection from the rain and strong winds. Now, thanks in part to your generosity, Claudia has a new home with a concrete floor, a metal roof and a door that locks. She has also been blessed with a new job, for which she thanks God with all her heart.

BUILDING THE KINGDOM

Your generosity has had an incredible impact on families in rural Guatemala, an area considered to have the most severe poverty in Latin America. One of the biggest challenges Christian leaders faced in this area was the lack of safe shelter. The housing that existed in those rural communities would barely be considered habitable by our standards, and yet due to their circumstances, most Guatemalan families had little hope of escaping their plight.

> Christian missionary Carlos Vargas was able to change that — empowered by your support. The son of poor Guatemalan parents himself, Carlos today helps other poor families improve their living conditions through a Christian ministry he founded, **Esperanza de Vida**



(Spanish for "Hope of Life"). We have partnered with this ecumenical Christian ministry for years. It runs an orphanage, a home for the elderly, a school, vocational and microenterprise programs, a distribution warehouse for donated goods, a house-building program, a feeding outreach to the garbage dump community, and an emergency nutrition center.

In 2015, Cross International partnered with Carlos and his team to build homes for 27 needy families in three rural Guatemalan villages. Each benefiting family received a Bible, a Gospel message and got connected to a local church.

Ana's Dream Fulfilled

Ana Gabriela Suchite is a single mother with two children. For many years, she lived in a tiny hut that had holes in the roof. When it rained, the water would pour in and the floor would become a mudpit. Night after night, Ana prayed to God, asking for a safe, secure house. Finally, Ana received the answer to her prayers when she heard that she was to receive a new home with a concrete floor, a metal roof and a door that locks. She says she is very grateful to the donors who made her dream a reality.



IMPACT in Zambia

SAVED BY GRACE

When Beauty Phiri's mother died of AIDS, her father abandoned her and her sister, and the devastated children were split among separate caregivers. Beauty, who is HIV positive, went to live with her elderly grandmother, while her sister went to live with another family. Beauty rarely sees her sister anymore.

Sadly, Beauty's plight is common in Zambia and other African countries where the HIV/AIDS pandemic has practically wiped out an entire adult generation. As a result of these deaths, countless children live with elderly grandparents, extended relatives, neighbors — or on their own. Many grow up destitute. Some are exploited. Almost all face a lifetime of struggle.

In Zambia, it's difficult for these orphaned children to finish school because their focus is on daily survival. Those who are able to complete free grade schools are rarely able to continue on to high school because fees are required. It's also a challenge to come up with school uniforms and supplies.

Thanks to your help, however, in 2015 **Grace Ministries** was able to send 70 orphaned Zambian children to school — including 14-year-old Beauty. In 2015 she entered her first year of high school. Beauty's destitute grandmother confirmed that the Cross International scholarship made the difference. It gave her granddaughter an opportunity to attend school.

Along with the scholarship, Beauty receives regular visits from Veronica, a volunteer with Grace Ministries. Veronica checks on Beauty's well-being, prays with her, counsels her and ensures that access to social services is provided by Grace Ministries to meet her immediate needs. Beauty's long-term success is bolstered by a solid education made possible through the scholarship provided by donors like you. She is very grateful! ...For Beauty, the Cross International scholarship made the difference.



Food


