THRIVING KIDS SUCCESS STORIES

ABIGAIL | GUATEMALA

She came to us as a frightened 4-year-old from an abusive home. Now she is a grown woman, successful and thriving!

Abigail was just 4 years old when she first came to live at Casa Bernabe — one of Cross International's most treasured ministry partners based in Guatemala City, Guatemala.

Abigail was placed in the Casa Bernabe orphanage by the Guatemalan court system. As you can imagine, it was a period of great confusion for the young girl. But thanks to the love and tender care that she received from her caregivers, Abigail grew to accept Casa Bernabe as her home. She also got to know the other resident kids and discovered that they had been through similar life experiences.

"I came to realize that there were other kids just like me," said Abigail. "That helped a lot."

Another thing that helped Abigail was her growing faith in God. Every morning, her house parents would hold a daily devotional, so Abigail could learn how Jesus loved her.

Abigail excelled in school, and went to college, where she gravitated towards marketing and communications. Abigail received her degree and landed a job at a marketing firm in Guatemala City. "I started doing digital entry," she said. "As the business grew, they didn't have a quality control department, and I started doing that. Today, I am a senior officer."

Abigail's success in the workplace would not have been possible without the training and mentorship she received at Casa Bernabe. "I had jobs to do at Casa Bernabe from the time I was 10 years old," recalls Abigail. "That experience prepared me well."

God has great plans for Abigail. He brought her to Casa Bernabe at a young age. And thanks to your support of the 35 children who benefit from our Pathway to the Future program, kids like Abigail are able to grow, mature and escape poverty.



NELSON I MALAWI

Nelson was 10 years old when he came to us hungry and homeless. Now he is a university scholar!

When Nelson was first admitted into the Cross International/ Ambuya Development Center's Education and Nutrition Program — which in FY2024 benefited 351 vulnerable children — no one had any idea that he would become the bright and accomplished young man he turned out to be.

At that time, Nelson was one of many impoverished, malnourished and marginalized children living with a single mom and two siblings in a one-room shack. He was also behind in school because his mom would keep him at home — unable to provide the uniform or pay the school fees. Thankfully, Cross and Ambuya Development Center heard about Nelson's plight and intervened. For the first time in his life, the young boy began attending school on a regular basis.

Nelson worked extra hard, and with the help of his counselors and teachers, bolstered by a healthy lunch and a nurturing Christian class environment, the boy began to thrive. He showed an innate intelligence to go with a strong work ethic. Soon, Nelson not only caught up with his schoolwork, he regularly scored at the top of his class.

In his final year of secondary school, Nelson was accepted to attend college at the Malawi University of Science and Technology (MUST) in suburban Blantyre. For an entire year, Nelson saved his money and prayed to God that one day he would be able to attend.

Finally, Nelson's prayers were answered. A generous donor agreed to pay his tuition. Now 20 years old, Nelson is in his second year of a four-year bachelor's degree program at MUST. Once he gets his degree, a wealth of opportunities will open up for the young man.

FY2024 IMPACT

In our Fiscal Year 2024 (7/1/23 - 6/30/24), through our Thriving Kids Initiative, Cross International served **147,951** children and their family members in **15** countries across **4** continents. Thanks to your partnership, we worked alongside **35** local Christian partner organizations — schools, orphanages, clinics, feeding centers and community organizing groups. Together with you, we showed God's love by implementing **70** projects, resulting in many important accomplishments. We have highlighted those accomplishments in this report.





FOOD & NUTRITION

30,334 children and 32,132 adults were provided lifesaving food.3,649 children were served hot meals at the schools we partnered with.3,036,960 servings of fortified rice were distributed.





HEALTH & MEDICAL CARE


1,540 adults and 2,056 children received medical care.
